Dear WIT Liaison,

As you've probably saw in the last news letter and on FaceBook, we had a very successful eXchange at Arrowmont in September. We are looking forward to planning a second eXchange next year or in the spring of 2020. But you and the women in your area don't have to wait until then or travel to Gatlinburg. We would like to see the event on a smaller scale in different areas of the country. If you know of a facility in your area and have access to lathes and other equipment, please consider helping to coordinate your own local eXchange. This wouldn't necessarily be limited to women in your chapter –reach out to the other chapters that are reasonably close to you. Anyone of the WIT committee members would be happy to talk to you about how it would work. It may not be something you feel you can do, but you may know someone who would be willing to take this on. Don't hesitate to reach out! We are looking forward to planning a second eXchange next year or in the spring of 2020.

Fall/winter seems to be the time for renewing club memberships and recruiting new members. Now may be the time for you to start pushing the WIT membership grants. If there is a woman in your chapter who has never been an AAW member, you can submit her name for a 50% membership grant. WIT will pay 50% of her AAW membership for the first year. If she's not been a member of your chapter before and you can convince her to join, WIT will increase that to 100% of her membership fee for the first year. That is an incredible gift! This year AAW will be piloting a change to the AAW grants. By combining what were know as the EOG grants, equipment grants, WIT grants, and POP grants under one committee with input from the various committees involved, we hope to handle the grant requests more effectively. Instead of being processed quarterly, the WIT grants will now be processed annually.
